

PSALM 121

Dear Friends,

The Blessing of the Animals is always enlightening. These creatures who need our care bring out our better selves. I remember so well when I used to come home to my Wheaton terrier, no matter how I had neglected her by my absence, she would greet me with exuberance. If I pushed her away she would come back more eagerly. Scolded her for jumping, she would love me. Yell at her for getting on the sofa, she would love me. She responded to my touch with love. She responded to my love with love. Am I deserving of such love? I am not. How would you name such love?

Recently I watched again Fred Roger's testimony in front of a Senate Committee as he made the case for PBS. He tells them the words of a song he wrote. It begins,

"What do you do with the mad that you feel When you feel so mad you could bite?"

and it finishes,

"I can stop when I want to
Can stop when I wish.
I can stop, stop, stop any time.
And what a good feeling to feel like this
And know that the feeling is really mine.
Know that there's something deep inside
That helps us become what we can.
For a girl can be someday a woman
And a boy can be someday a man."

The Senators are visibly moved to tears by the idea that children can be taught self-control like this by calling upon their better nature. The Committee awarded PBS the \$20m they were asking for and Mr. Rogers' Neighborhood, and, in due course, Sesame Street was funded. You can find the video online and it is well-worth watching.

It is not hard to draw a lesson for the time in which we live. We are a society in dire need of an ethic and of self-control. It goes without saying that not matter how angry we are, we should choose not to bite. But I wonder if you can look beyond that truth to something simpler. The simpler, and harder, truth is that we should choose to make neighbors. Make neighbors of everyone, as dogs do, without prejudice, deserved or undeserved, long before the biting starts. That is what God does. That is the gospel, and the work of the Church.




### Introducing St. Paul's New Website



### TEC


