Given by Mrs. Samuel Collins of Windom, MN, in memory of her husband Samuel Collins (1828-1882), a former member of the parish and Senior Warden. He was born in Norfolk, England, and died in Windom, MN. Mr. Collins was a millwright and during his life, he built mills in Owatonna and Windom, MN.

This chair, and most of the chancel furniture, was designed by Spencer A. Perceval, Esq., of England.
