Dear Friends,

Well, now you know what Jesus looks like, go and find him everywhere!

A blessed Epiphany to you. Church nerds will remember that strictly speaking the Christmas season could be said not to end until the Feast of the Presentation (of the infant Jesus) (in the Temple) on February 2nd, but it has already been lapped and overlapped by stories of a 30 year old Jesus being baptized, the calling of the disciples, the arrival of the Wise Eastern Persons, if we had time for them (we didn't), and we are careening away from Christmas as fast our legs can carry us because there is just so much to cram in here. But do you remember what Jesus looks like?

At Christmas the nebulous Word, through whom is made all that is-was-will be, the essence of things, is a baby. Just pause there for what a polite person would consider a reasonable length of time. And now that you have recovered some inkling of what that looks like, go and find Jesus everywhere. Or, in the words of the Baptismal Covenant that we joined ourselves to again as Jesus went down into the river last Sunday, "seek and serve Christ in all (no exceptions) persons." For in Jesus' words, "the Kingdom of heaven has drawn very near." This is the season of making God visible – Epiphany.

Not coincidentally it is also what we believe our little Church is most called to do and to be. My hope, though, is you can remember Christmas well enough to go out and find it, go out and keep declaring it, now, in our world, enabled and supported by this community of Godly people with whom, either in the flesh, or in spirit, we all sang and prayed so fervently at Christmas just two short weeks ago.

We often speak of ourselves as being an "Easter people." Well maybe we are equally an "Epiphany people." At least for this season the priority is clear. A blessed Christmas-Epiphany to you.
