VESTRY NOTES

It has been a busy and productive summer at St. Paul's! In July we held our annual rummage sale, earning about \$1,000. Thanks to everyone who helped set up, price, work, and haul away the unsold items. It was a group effort, and fun to be back doing some of our traditional events. Then, shortly after the sale, the AC unit mounted in the loft area at the back of Upper Tanner began leaking. Thankfully Jody noticed it one night while when she stopped in briefly and was able to turn off the air and place a bucket underneath the leak. Roger Warehime discovered the hose was plugged up and the drip pan under the unit was corroded through. He contacted Owatonna Heating and Cooling and Jr. Warden Nikki met with them. The new pan needs to be custom made because the unit is older and the pan is a non-standard size. So, the AC is not yet fixed, but it will be soon. This is an unforeseen expense during a time when we are eeking by and hoping to not have to make another PIF withdrawal.

Thankfully, we hosted a very successful parking lot during the fair. In the end, we earned roughly \$3,700. Many, many thanks to Steve and Sheryl for organizing and setting the parking lot up. The project was offered to us last minute, and Sheryl ran with it. We had 21 volunteers this year, down from 36 in 2018. Thanks to all of you who pitched in! We could not have done it without you.

Some of our other "regular" events have returned, too. Wednesday's Spiritual Adventures has been happening all summer until Fr. Michael went on vacation. It will resume next week, September 8. We are hosting a meal for San Jose Obrero on September 12, and on September 26 we will have a "Renewal Sunday" potluck at Gainey park. Wednesday evening programming will resume after that on September 29.

The vestry is monitoring the Covid situation. For now we have decided to continue with indoor worship. Masks are not required, but are encouraged if you are not vaccinated or for other reasons are vulnerable.

CLEANING HELP NEEDED!

You don't have to do it all, and you don't have to do it every week. Below is a description of what needs to be done. When you sign up, Drew will contact you about dates. We have broken up the church into segments that would require only forty-five minutes to one hour of your time. These areas are:

Vacuum the narthex, nave and chancel.

Normally, this can be done at any time during the week.

Vacuum the upper and lower hallway, arrange tables and vacuum in upper Tanner. It would be best if this was done before Weds, but it can happen at any time

Sweep and wipe down the bathrooms.

You may also need to mop as well. These need to be done sometime between Wednesday and Sunday.

Sweep and mop the tile and vacuum the carpets in the entrances and stairwells. Once a month in summer, almost weekly in winter between Wednesday and Sunday.

Other: Dust mopping under the pews; dust mopping after a gathering in Brown Hall; Intensive dusting and polishing.

This year we will be partnering with St. Mark's in Lake City to sponsor the worship services and meals for the migrant workers in Montgomery on September 12.. We are providing the food. Maria has a contact who will make pupusas, rice, and beans for \$2.50 a plate. We will also provide salad, fresh fruit, and beverages. We have ordered 100 meals and are hoping to raise \$500. Extra money will be used to buy fruit the workers can take home with them after the service, as we have seen from past years that this is appreciated. We will be taking donations in our "Second Sunday" baskets on both September 5 and 12.

We are also looking for people to help purchase and prepare the food for the rest of the meal and serve the food after the service. Please talk to Maria, Kristin, or Jody if you are able to help or would like to know more. The first service starts at 3:30 with a meal afterwards. There will be about a 45 minute break and then the second meal will be served before the second service. Helpers need not stay for the second service.


