

Dear Friends.

How important is it for you to give thanks? What do you give thanks for? Covid has concentrated the mind a little bit. It's possible that we are even clearer now about what is important, and what we are thankful for.

Understanding the essential nature of gratitude has become one of the holiest innovations of the American experiment. As usual shortly after Thanksgiving comes Advent, as we prepare for and look forward to Christmas. Last year we decorated the exterior of the Church, week by week, until at length we completed our worship on Christmas Eve by gathering outdoors together on a very cold night, around a fire, listening to the carols Jackie and Ellie were playing for us through the open window. CLEANING HELP NEEDED!

You don't have to do it all, and you don't have to do it every week. Below is a description of what needs to be done. When you sign up, Drew will contact you about dates. We have broken up the church into segments that would require only forty-five minutes to one hour of your time. These areas are:

Vacuum the narthex, nave and chancel. Normally, this can be done at any time during the week.

Vacuum the upper and lower hallway, arrange tables and vacuum in upper Tanner. It would be best if this was done before Weds, but it can happen at any time

Sweep and wipe down the bathrooms.

You may also need to mop as well. These need to be done sometime between Wednesday and Sunday.

Sweep and mop the tile and vacuum the carpets in the entrances and stairwells. Once a month in summer, almost weekly in winter between Wednesday and Sunday.

Other: Dust mopping under the pews; dust mopping after a gathering in Brown Hall; Intensive dusting and polishing.
